The successful applicant is expected to

- Assist in forensic autopsies including special preparation techniques.
- · Participate in on-call duties.
- Share the co-responsibility for the organisation of the autopsy area including input (materials and consumables), administration of case data and image material.
- Be responsible for the preservation and storage of materials and post-mortem tissue specimens.
- Support the teaching activities in the institute.
- Support the postmortem imaging (CT, X-ray) proceedings.
- Participate in research projects as required.

Profile and eligibilty criteria

- Certified professional training as an autopsy/mortuary technician or equivalent training.
- High motivation and interest in taking over the job responsible.
- Good knowledge and skills in special autopsy techniques as well as the proper production and storage of evidence objects.
- Organizing skills and computer skills (Word, Excel, Outlook, management of image material).
- Ability to work under pressure and time flexibility.
- Driving license.
